Bonding With Your Baby What's Happening Attachment is a deep, lasting bond that develops between a caregiver and child during the baby's first few years of life This attachment is crucial to the growth of a baby's body and mind Babies who have this bond and feel loved have a better chance to grow

Helping your baby to talk

Babies begin to learn from the moment they are born - first receptive language skills (understanding what they hear), then expressive language skills (speaking) You can help develop both kinds of language skills by talking, watching, listening, playing and sharing books with your baby Talking • Talk to your baby often, speaking
