Sir Rhys ap Thomas, Derwydd was said to have sheltered Henry Tudor on his way to Bosworth When he landed at Milford Haven to claim the crown from Richard III and end the War of the Roses, he was entertained at Derwydd and supplied with 5,000 Welsh soldiers who marched with him to victory at the Battle of Bosworth
